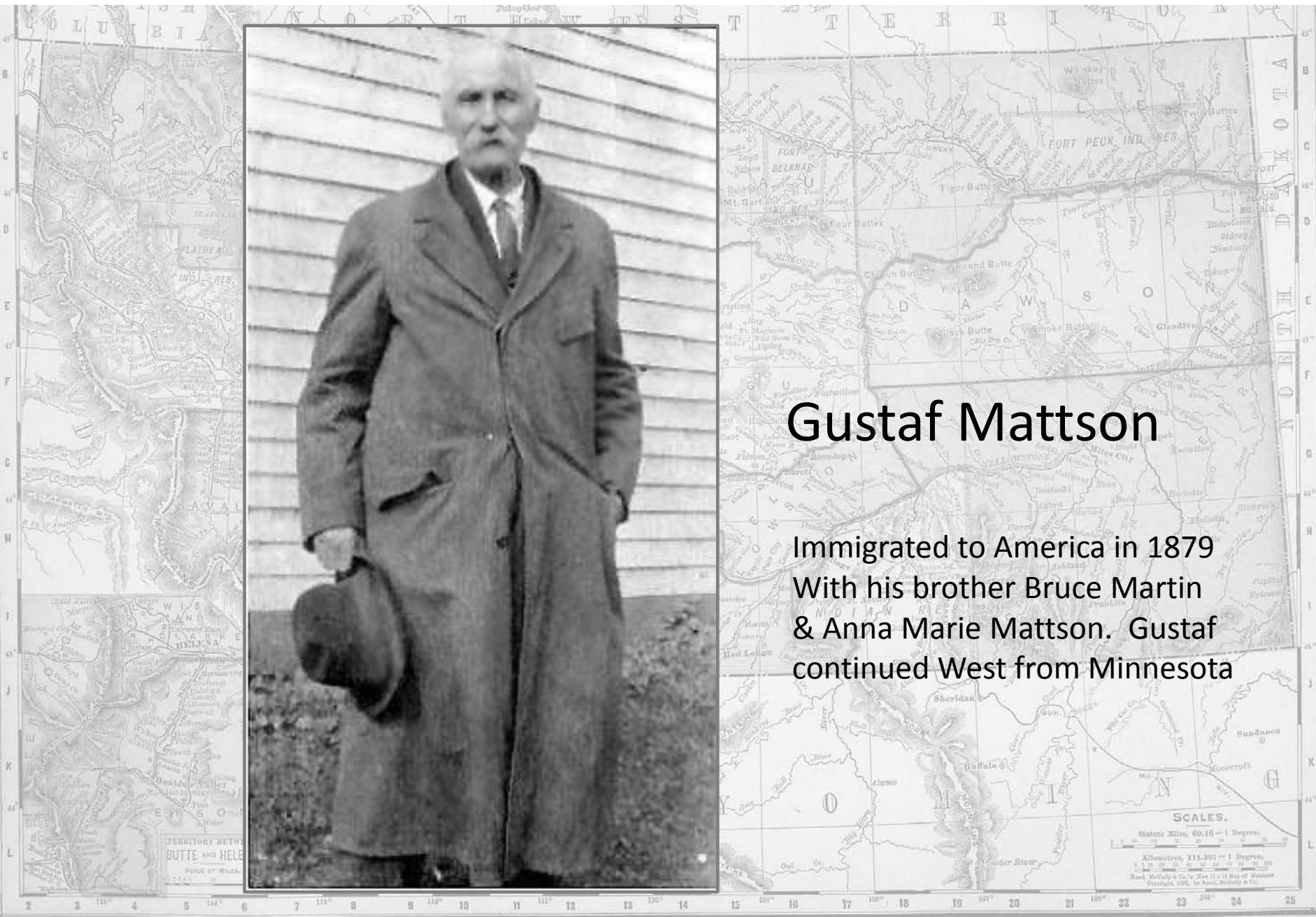


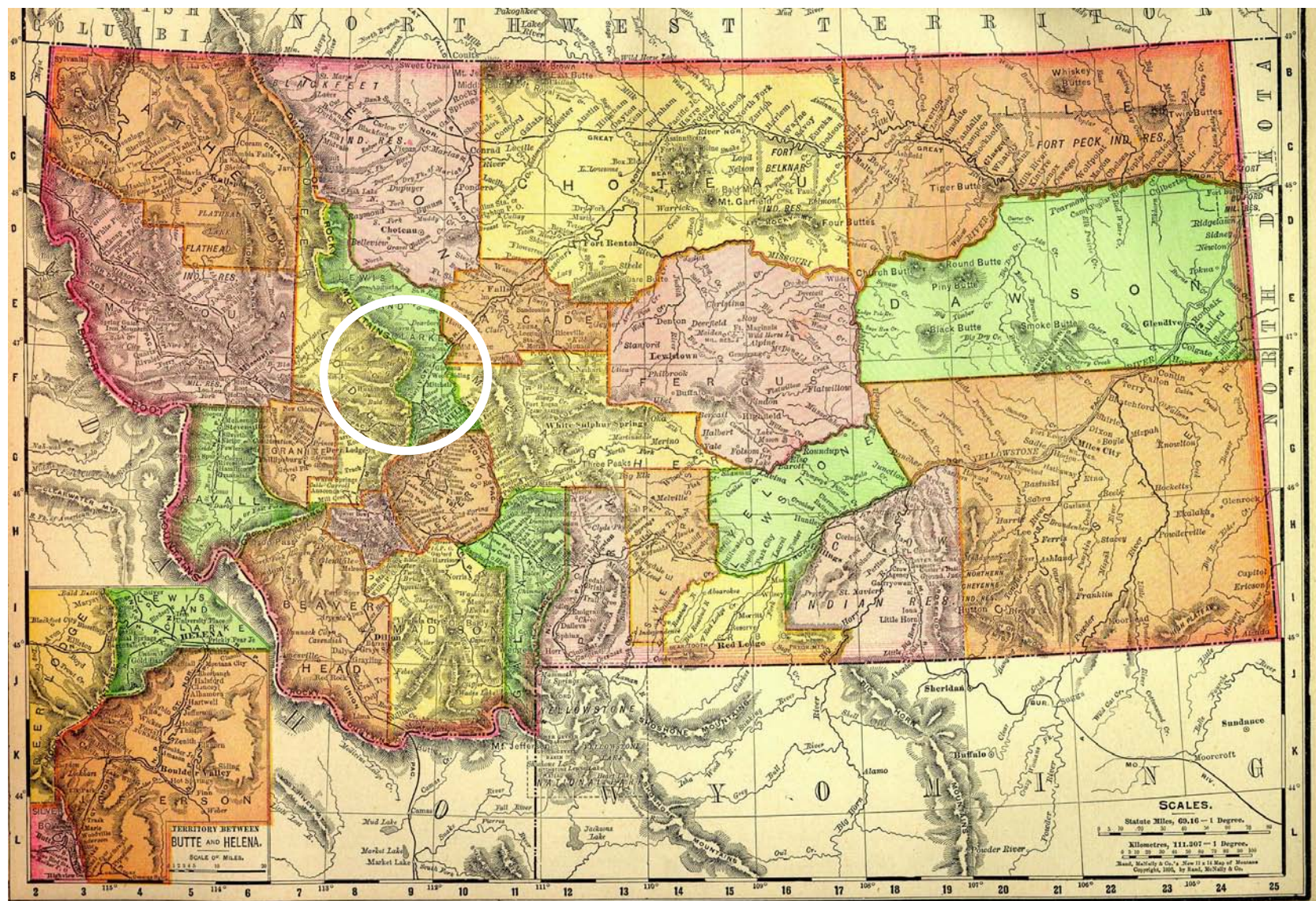



# Gustaf Mattson

Helena, MT 1885

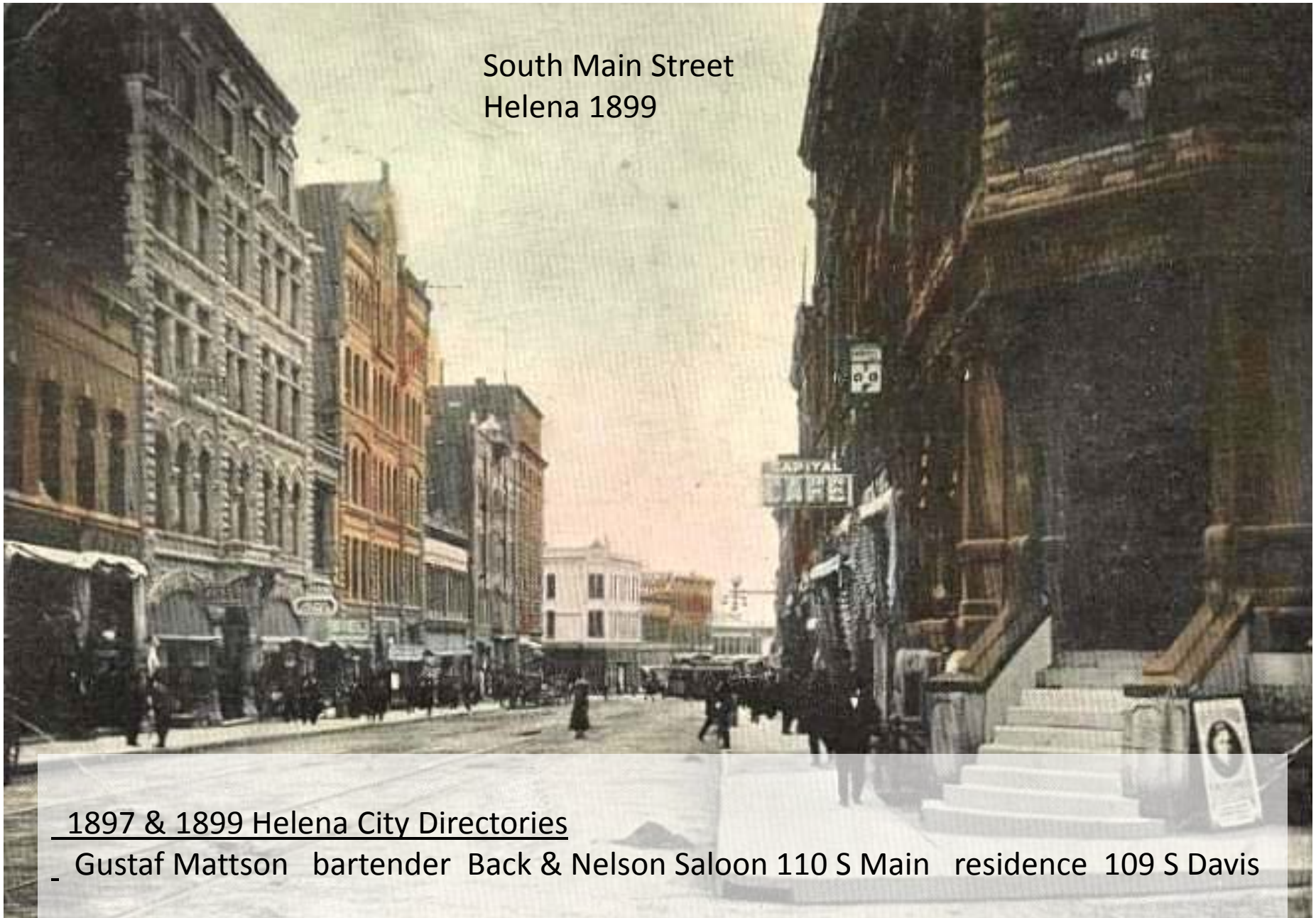

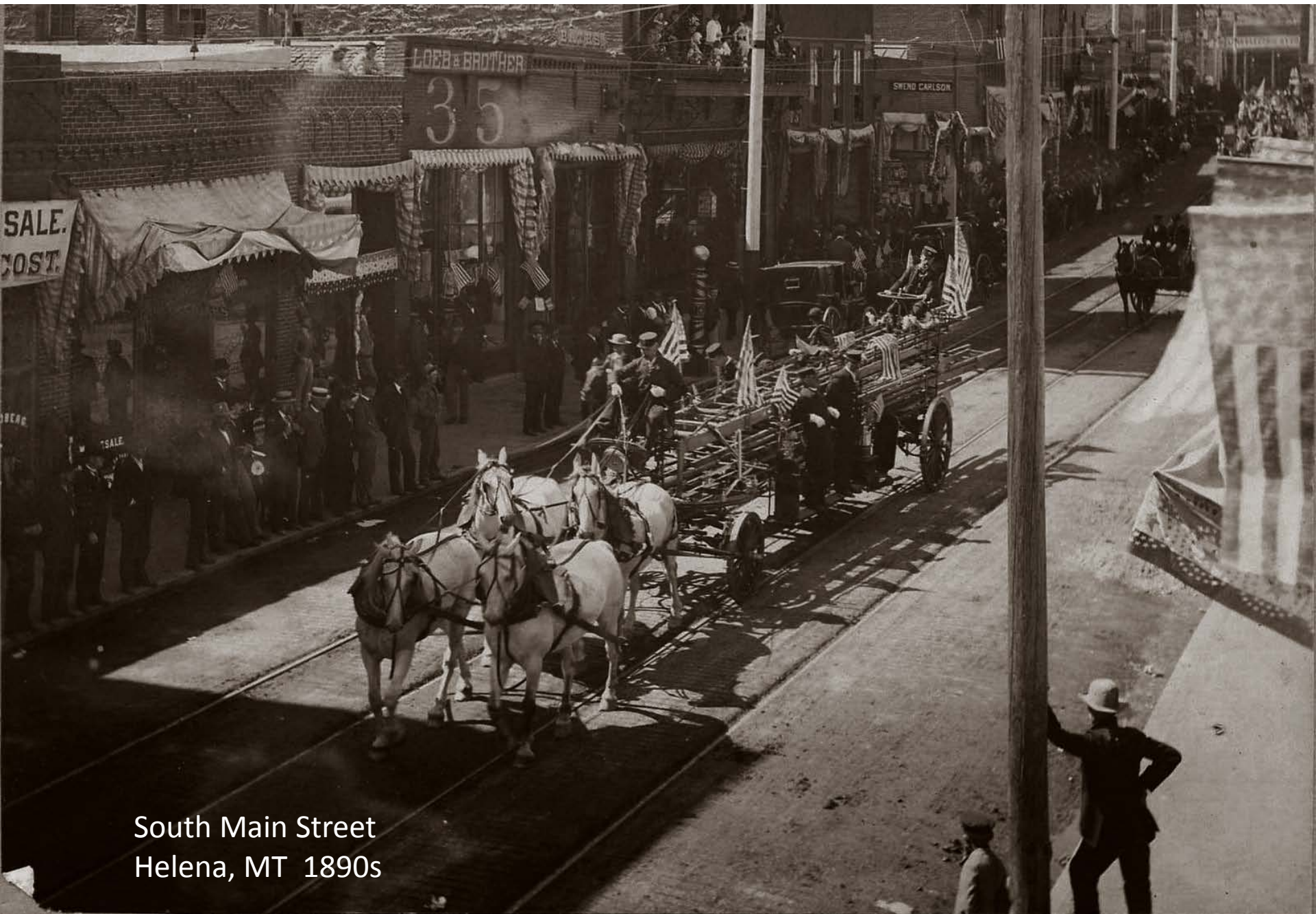

Helena 1899

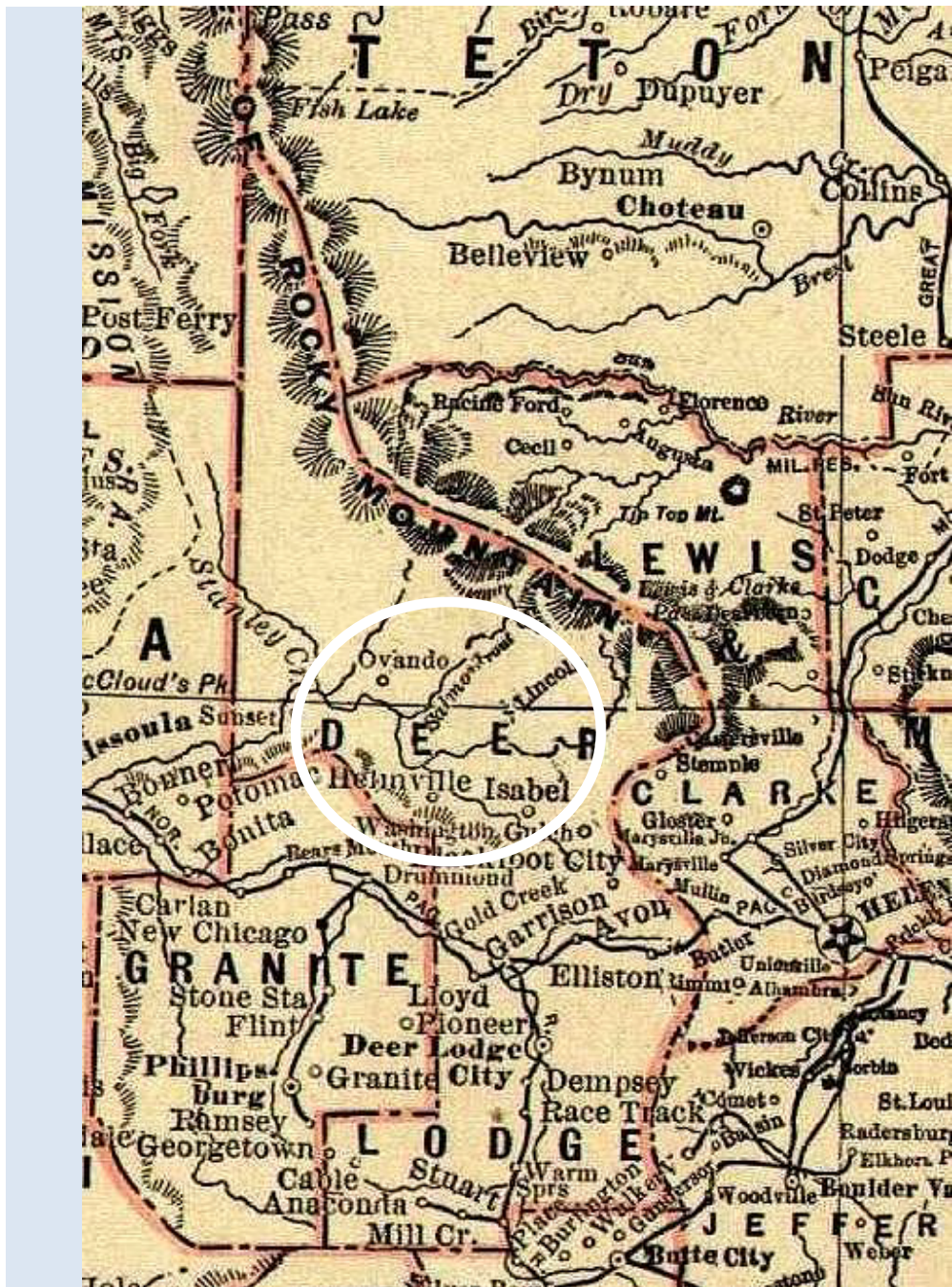

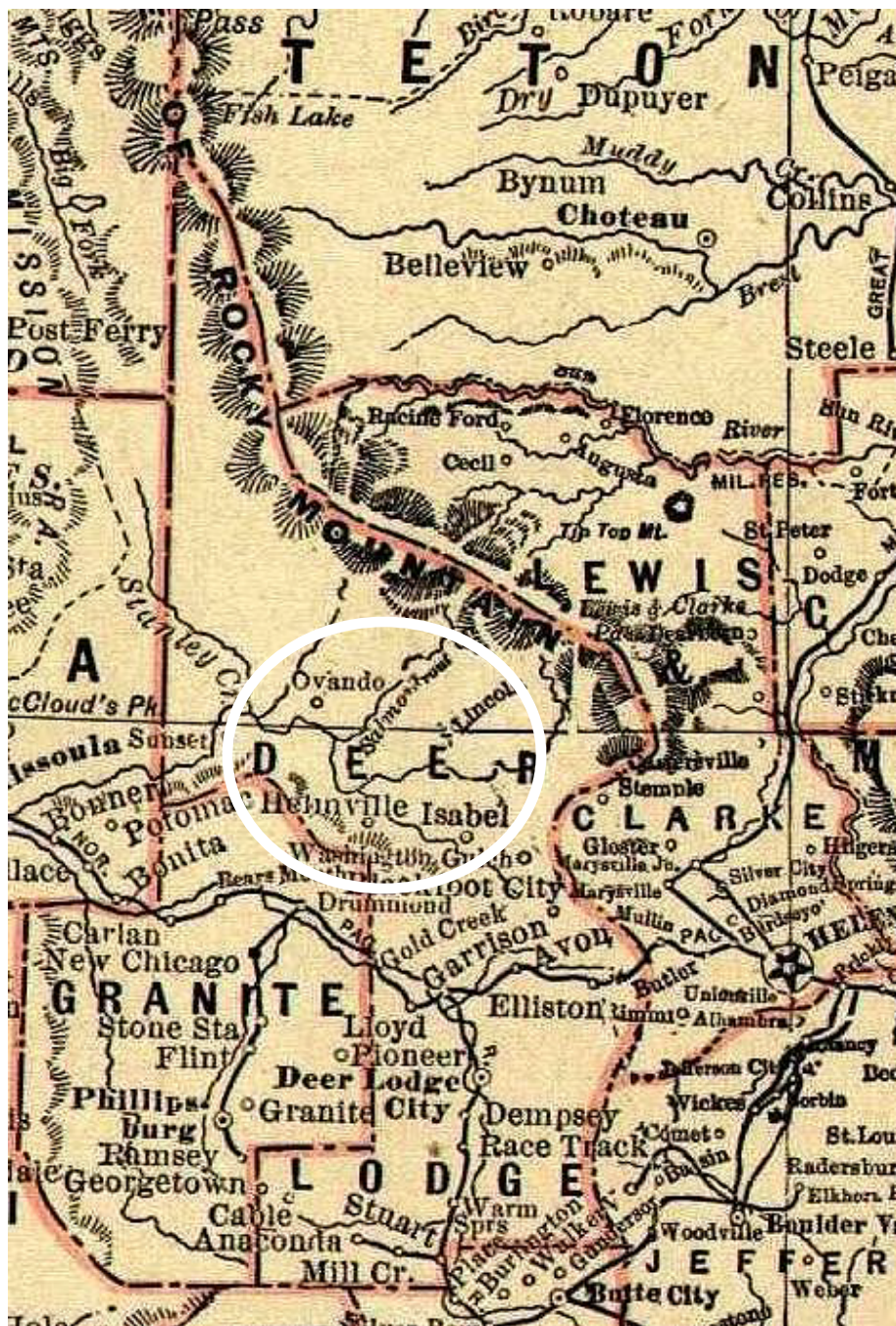


South Main Street

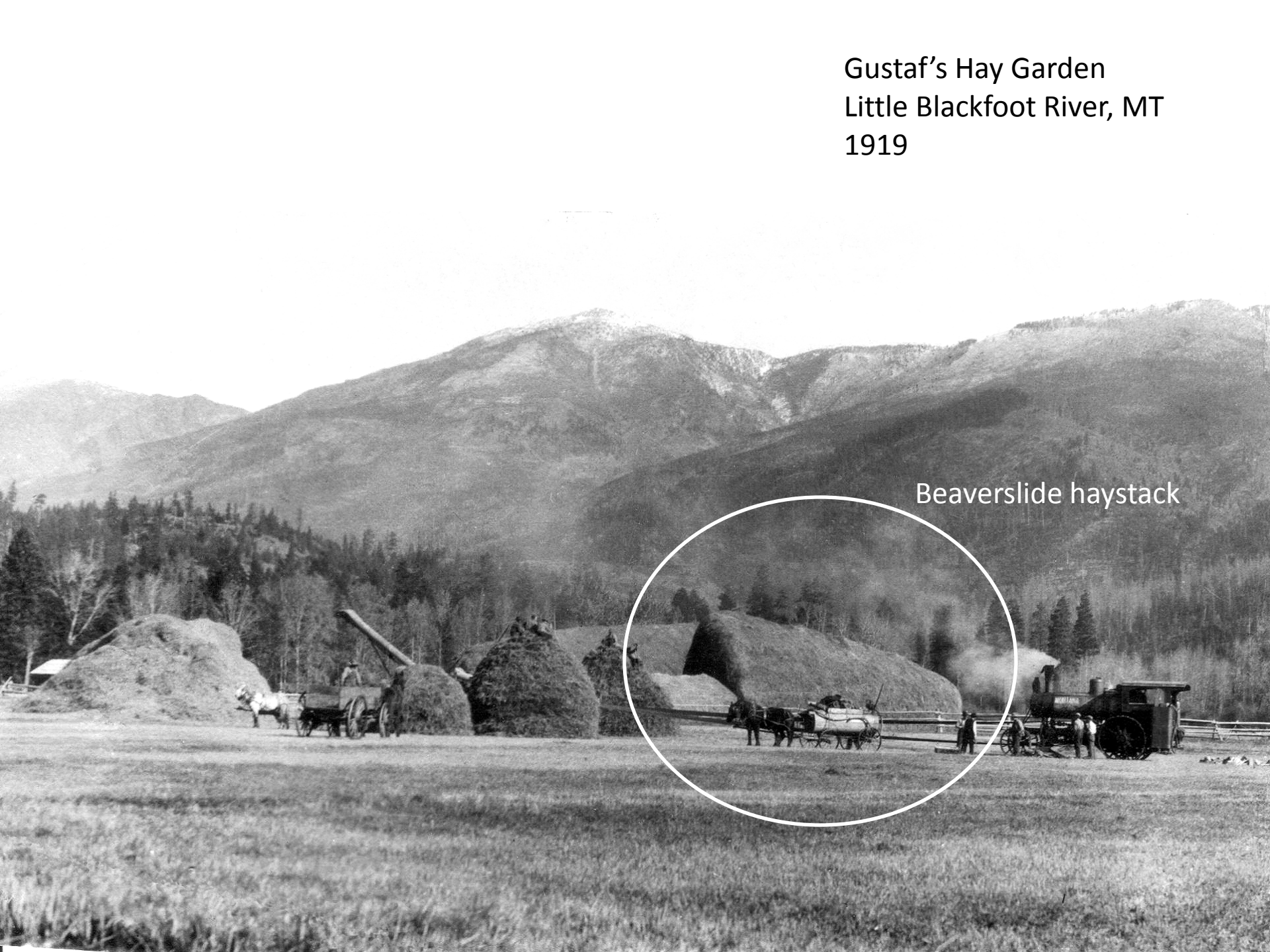

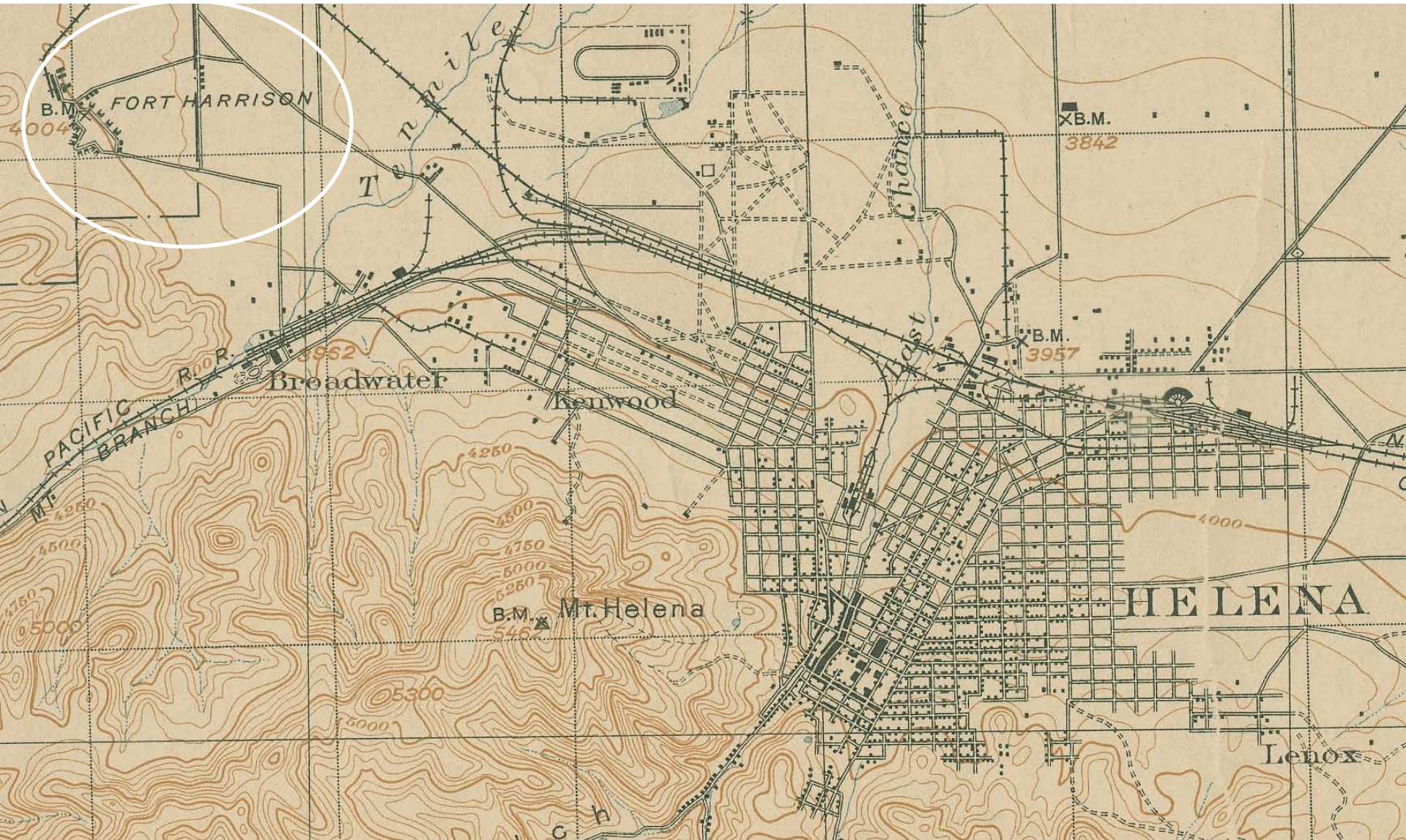


Great Northern RR Depot

Ft William Henry Harrison, Helena.

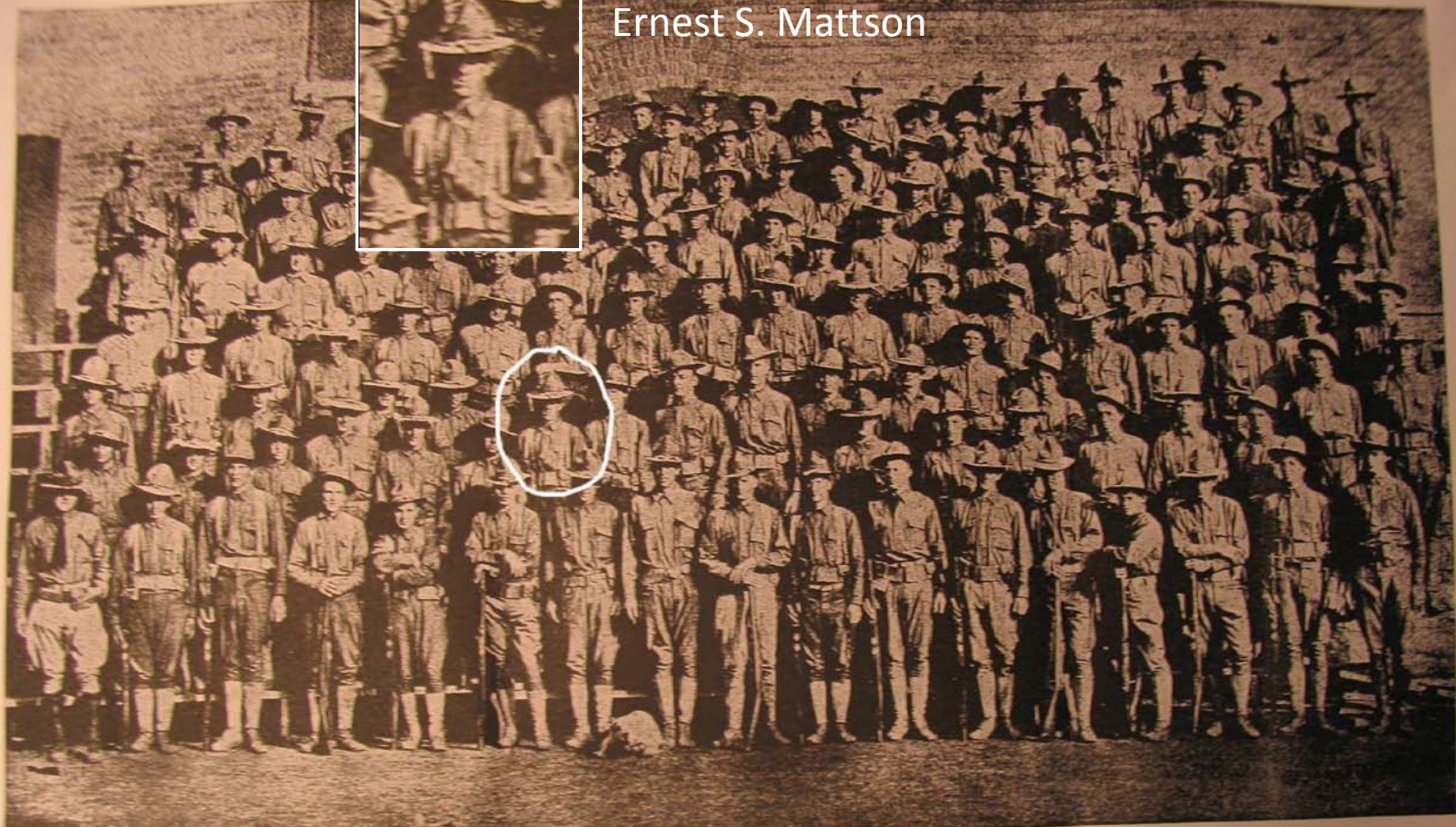
